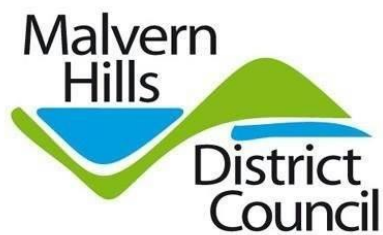


2019 Village Facilities and Rural Transport Study Update Topic Paper



November 2024

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1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Government's National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) 2021 paragraph 79 states:

"To promote sustainable development in rural areas, housing should be located where it will enhance or maintain the vitality of rural communities. Planning policies should identify opportunities for villages to grow and thrive, especially where this will support local services. Where there are groups of smaller settlements, development in one village may support services in a village nearby."

- 1.2. As part of the evidence base submitted to support the South Worcestershire Development Plan Review (SWPDR), the South Worcestershire Councils (SWCs)¹ undertook a Village Facilities and Rural Transport Study (VFRTS) 2019 ([ALL9](#)). The study identified key services, employment and sustainable transport opportunities across 177 villages and settlements in South Worcestershire. Each village was assigned a Category from 1 – 4 / open with '1' being settlements benefitting from the most facilities, and '4 / open' being settlements with the fewest or no services and those in the open countryside.
- 1.3. For completeness, the reader should be aware that Towns² and the City of Worcester are not included with the VFRTS survey as their level of sustainability has been established by virtue of their settlement status within policy SWDPR 03.
- 1.4. In advance of the SWDPR examination in public, and as five years have passed since the last VFRTS, the SWCs have taken the decision to update the 2019 VFRTS in order to provide an up to date position on community services and facilities and to align with the Infrastructure Delivery Plan. Using the same methodology as identified in [ALL13](#) 'VFRTS Methodology 2018' (submitted as evidence to support the SWDPR), parish councils were asked to provide an update on their 2019 responses for each settlement. The SWCs decided not to amend the methodology in order to provide a direct comparison between the 2019 VFRTS and this update. As there has been no change in methodology, a consultation has not taken place. As in 2019, Worcestershire County Council provided information on local bus routes and availability of transport from each location in the study in September 2024 and this is shown in appendix 2.
- 1.5. This report provides an updated position, analyses of the results of the survey and provides updated technical evidence to the SWDPR. **The study is not a decision-**

making document. Its purpose is only to assess the relative availability of key facilities and sustainable transport options throughout the settlements and report factual information. The categorisation of villages allows them to be compared with one another, but is not intended to determine any planning process, and will need to be considered in the context of the emerging SWDPR.

- 1.6. As a result of this study, any changes in categorisation of settlements will be highlighted. Any changes however may not necessarily result in an impact on the proposed allocations within the submitted SWDPR, unless officers consider a significant change in sustainability, for example an increase or decrease of more than one Category.
- 1.7. The reader should also be reminded that the VFRTS is not the sole determinant for the level of growth within a settlement. The SWDPR and associated proposed allocations have been informed by a number of factors including the availability and deliverability of sites, as well as the individual constraints and opportunities which exist at each settlement. Other considerations, in particular the SWDPR's spatial strategy, viability and connection to sustainable infrastructure are also vital decision-making factors which are not considered by the VFRTS. Therefore, no decisions have been or should be taken or inferred to be taken by this VFRTS update alone.

2. Overview of survey results

- 2.1. Whilst every reasonable effort was made to gather completed surveys, 17 responses from parish councils were not received. In this instance the SWCs took the decision to update the information using a desktop study, for example Google Maps and reviewing parish council websites.
- 2.2. There were four changes either from or to settlements across categories 1-3. Across settlement categories 4 and open there were 20 changes between the two. Further details on these changes can be viewed in Section 3.

3. Detailed changes in categorisations

Changes to Category 1 settlements in 2019

- **Harvington** is moving from Category 1 to Category 2. Its key services have reduced from four to three, following the closure of the post office. The settlement retains a general shop, village hall and primary school. The village has access to all public transport journey types, as outlined in Appendix 2. Overall Score 25 – VFRTS 2024 Category 2. There are neither housing, nor employment allocations within the

SWDPR for Harvington. The settlement does have an allocation of 40 dwellings within the emerging Harvington Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Changes to Category 2 settlements in 2019

- The combined settlement of **Crowle and Crowle Green** is moving from a Category 2 to a Category 1. Since the 2019 study the settlement has gained a general shop, taking its key services from 3 to 4. The settlement retains a separate post office, village hall and primary school. The village has access to all public transport journey types. Overall Score 26 – VFRTS Category 1. There is one housing allocation for 40 dwellings proposed within the SWDPR for the settlement (CFS0019).
- **Beckford** has been reassigned from Category 2 to Category 4, owing to the loss of a general shop including post office, which closed in December 2020. This reduced their key services from three to one (a village hall). The village does have access to all public transport journey types however the methodology indicates that a single key service as a village hall results in no more than Category 4. Overall Score 17 – VFRTS Category 4. Beckford has no proposed allocations within the SWDPR.

Changes to Category 3 settlements in 2019

- **Littleworth** has been reassigned from Category 3 to Category 2, owing to an increase in key services from one to three. The additional services, brought to the SWCs attention by the survey, were a village hall and a primary school. Littleton residents have access to all public transport journey types. Overall score 17 – VFRTS Category 2. Littleworth has no proposed allocations within the SWDPR.
- **Bransford** has been reassigned as a Category 4 from a Category 3. This has not been due to the closure of any key services, however it is believed that in the previous survey the primary school was mistakenly reported as being within the settlement of Bransford, when it is outside of the boundary. Further the school is not a primary school, rather an independent school for children between 8 to 19 years of age with Special Educational Needs and Difficulties. Bransford residents have access to all but type A public transport journeys. Overall score 14 – VFRTS Category 4. For context, Leigh Sinton and Bransford form the Leigh and Bransford Designated Neighbourhood Area with an adopted Neighbourhood Development Plan in place since November 2022. Bransford itself has no proposed allocations within the SWDPR. There is a Neighbourhood Development Plan allocation of 52, however this is in the settlement of Leigh Sinton.

Changes to Category 4 / open countryside settlements in 2019

- 3.1. As discussed in the 2019 VFRTS, Category 4 / open countryside settlements vary in regard to their access to key services and sustainable transport, therefore the full VFRTS detailed scores (Appendix 1) and Sustainable Transport by Settlement Update (Appendix 2), which are available to download alongside this update report, should be consulted when comparing settlements in these lower categories.
- 3.2. For the purposes of this update, and to observe a consistent approach, the Councils have decided to take a pragmatic and consistent approach to categories 4 and open countryside. Those settlements with no trip types and only up to three secondary services, will be categorised as open countryside. Those settlements with access to public transport trip types of at least B, C, D, E, F and G have been categorised as at least Category 4, owing to their connectivity. This is in-line with the 2019 methodology, which discusses Category 4 and open countryside settlements as having a zero or low to medium level of sustainable transport.
- **Sychampton** benefits from one key service, a primary school, and benefits from all public transport trip types. According to the methodology, this settlement will be re-categorised from open countryside to Category 3.
 - **Castlemorton** benefits from two key services, a village hall and a primary school. The settlement also includes six secondary services; two public houses, mobile library, church, community service, other community service and a pre-school. The Council has decided to re-categorise Castlemorton from open to Category 4 in-line with the methodology, as whilst the settlement is not well connected, it benefits from two key services and a number of secondary services. Overall score 12 – VFRTS Category 4.
 - **Abberley Village, Abberton, Alfrick Pound, Aldington, Broad Marston, Dunhampstead, Hanley Childe, Hindlip, Kerswell Green, Kinsham, Northampton, Pensax, Ryall and Holly Green, Stonehall and Upper Welland** were all categorised as 4 in the 2019 VFRTS, however based on the methodology the Council has taken the decision to re-categorise the settlements as open countryside, owing to them having up to only three secondary services and no trip types. This is also to bring about consistency across scoring.
 - **Brockamin, Cotheridge, Kinnersley, Monkwood and Netherton** benefit from a combination of trip types A, B, C, D, E, F, G and B, C, D, E, F, G and up to three secondary services only. Based on the methodology, they have been re-categorised

from open countryside to Category 4, given the sustainable transport available to residents.
